

Master Money in Pounds

Rationale

In this step, pupils build on their understanding of the value of coins and notes from Year 1 to identify amounts of money in pounds. They will begin by recognising amounts of coins in pounds before recognising amounts of mixed notes and coins in pounds.

Pupils will develop their learning by identifying amounts of money in pounds where the reverse side of some or all of the notes are shown.

Common Errors or Misconceptions

- Pupils may miscount the number of notes or coins and identify the amount incorrectly.
- Pupils may not identify the reverse side of the £1 and £2 coins correctly.

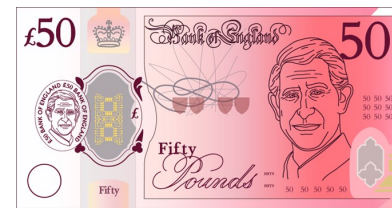


Key Representations

Coins and notes



There are two £2 coins and one £1 coin.
The amount is £5



There is one £50 note, one £2 coin and one £1 coin.
The amount is £53



There is one £20 note, one £10 note, one £5 note and one £2 coin. The amount is £27
